

Theme: Who is my neighbour to show compassion?

Today we have one of the most famous Gospel stories, the "Good Samaritan." There are four people in the story: 1) a Jewish priest, a man of deep religious convictions, serving in the Temple at Jerusalem; 2) a Levite, also a religious person with Temple connections; 3) a Samaritan, a traveller apparently on business -Samaritans were regarded by devout Jews as outsiders, heretics, people not to be seen in company with; 4) and an unknown man, beaten up by robbers on the roadside. He was presumably a Jew or a fellow-human being in great need of help.

The priest and the Levite were on the way to the Temple. They did not want to have contact with the injured man who was bleeding because that would render them "unclean" to go to the Temple to worship God. Just as anyone of us would have said: I am rushing to the last Sunday Mass. It will be a mortal sin if I do not go.

In the story, the injured man, a complete stranger, had a higher priority than the needs of any of the other three. The first two were rushing to the Temple to worship God. What they failed to realise was that a child of God and their own brother was right there lying on the road. God could have been worshipped right there! "As often as you do it to one of these the least of my brothers and sisters, you do it to me (Mt. 25:40). However, the only one of the three, the despised outsider, responded to the need. He was the one most apparently in a hurry. He applied first aid (oil and wine), found shelter for the man and paid all his expenses.

REFLECTION

The key word in the story is "compassion" used twice. Who is my neighbour? Anyone who shows mercy and compassion to a total stranger in need, unconditionally and without moral judgement. Love your neighbour as yourself is one arm of the most central commandment. Let us all be good neighbours! The Apostle James says in his Letter: "Faith without good works is dead." Faith which does not express itself in love is dead.

In the First Reading, the Israelites abandoned God and despised his laws and suffered exile because of this. Moses exhorted the Babylonian exiles to be faithful to the law, which God had given them when they returned to the Promised Land. If and when they return once more to God, and keep his commandments, he will prosper them once more.

In the Second Reading, Paul tells the Colossians that Christ has power over thrones, dominions, sovereignties, powers and all the mysterious powers that frighten them. None of them can escape his dominion. Therefore, if we keep close to Christ, no evil spirit can harm us or block our salvation. If we are united with Christ, we have nothing to fear.
