Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls)

Theme: The Reality of Death, Judgement, (Purgatory), Heaven and Hell

Why do we pray for the dead? 2 Maccabees 12:38-46 teaches us that if the dead were not to be raised it would have been foolish to pray for the dead, but we believe that they would be raised, and so it is a pious end, a holy and devout practice, that they might be released from their sins.

Today we celebrate all those who have died but need still a process of purification before they can come face to face with the all-holy God. All Souls' Day honors the deceased, especially those in Purgatory. The Church often speaks of the totality of the baptised as the Communion of Saints. The Communion of Saints is formed of three groups. I] those who have died and are now enjoying a face-to-face relationship with God for all eternity in heaven. II] those who are living on earth at the present time, and are part of the Pilgrim Church on its way to ultimate union with God in unending happiness. III] those who have died, but

are not quite ready to meet God face to face. Most of us would probably acknowledge that we are far from perfect, and that we still need to go through some purifying process before entering the eternal presence of God.

The Church reminds us that those who are already in the eternal presence of God, and those who are still on pilgrimage on earth can help the group we call 'Holy Souls' to reach the Vision of God sooner, through our good works and prayers. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* recommends prayer for the dead in conjunction with the offering of the Eucharistic Sacrifice, and encourages "*almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead*" (CCC #1032). Let us pray for our dear departed, have Masses offered for them, visit their graves, and make daily sacrifices for them. God can foresee and apply the merits of our prayers, penances, and works of charity, done even years after their death, for our departed dear ones, in favor of our deceased dear ones, at the moment of their deaths.

The first reading tells us that the sufferings of the righteous are not punishments but

opportunities to prove their fidelity to God. Now the trial period is over, and God has drawn the person to be with Him for consolation and eternal reward.

In the second reading, Paul tells us that justification by faith works because if God has done the most for a person by justifying him, then he will certainly do the least for him by taking him into heaven. God requires only faith in Jesus Christ and his death for sin. God has made peace with us. We stand in His grace, and we rejoice in the sure hope that we will share in His glory.

In the gospel, Jesus offers living water and bread of life to anyone who is thirsty or hungry. In order to be satisfied, people must hunger and thirst for real food and drink, not for the perishable kind. Jesus reproves his listeners for their lack of faith in him. Indeed, it is the will of God, that everyone who looks upon the Son and believes in him, shall have eternal life. Let us open our hearts today so that Jesus can fill them with his life-giving love.
